Performance of Main Branches

• Considerable growth of industrial production

In 2006 the industrial performance measured by the industrial production index grew by 9.7 % (year-on-year). A slightly higher increase was recorded by sales revenues from industrial operations, in real terms by 10.3 % higher than in 2005. The highest acceleration of the production growth rate occurred in Q1, however, Q4 showed a certain deceleration. The same development was shown by sales revenues increase.

 Best results achieved by mechanical engineering In 2006 the industrial production grew year-on-year particularly in mechanical engineering, namely manufacture of transport equipment (by 20.6 %), manufacture of machinery and equipment (by 18.0 %) and manufacture of electrical and optical equipment (by 16.3 %). Of the other most developing branches highest production increases were recorded by manufacture of rubber and plastic products (by 14.6 %) and wood processing (by 13.3 %). On the other hand the biggest decline was shown by manufacture of textiles and textile products (by 1.6 %).

• Sales revenues growth mostly due to direct exports

Among the main industrial groupings the highest growth in 2006 was recorded by manufacture of durable consumer goods (by 27.6 %) and capital goods (by 18.3 %). In Q4 sales revenues grew due to the increase of sales revenues from direct exports, in real terms by 12.3 %, in annual aggregate by 11.6 %. The highest sales revenues increase was achieved by manufacturing (by 10.9 %), in terms of organization by enterprises under foreign control (by 16.6 %).

 Increase of industrial wages lags behind sales development The average headcount in industry in 2006 grew by 1.0 % year-on-year. The average monthly wage in industry in 2006 amounted to CZK 19 400 and increased by 6.0 % year-on-year (in real terms by 3.4 %). Labour productivity in industry measured by sales revenues per employee increased in 2006 by 9.2 % year-on-year.

• High increase in construction

Also due to favourable weather conditions the construction output increased in late 2006 in real terms compared to Q4 of the preceding year by 9.5 % and in aggregate for 2006 by 6.6 %. The year-on-year increase of construction works under delivery contracts ("S") in 2006 in construction companies with 20+ employees in real terms amounted to 6.6 %, the highest growth was recorded by the volume of works abroad (by 73.7 %). In terms of organization better results were achieved by building enterprises (increase in real terms by 6.7 %) than civil engineering enterprises (5.0 %) however, upon a markedly different development in new domestic construction (9.0 % and 1.6 %) and in repair and maintenance (–11.0 % and 28.6 %). Labour productivity (measured by "S") increased in 2006 by 6.3 % year-on-year. The gross monthly nominal wage increased by 7.3 % year-on-year to CZK 20 304.

 Continued trend of less building permits with a higher value of constructions In 2006 investors were granted 135.4 thousand building permits with an approximate value of newly permitted constructions of CZK 360.9 bn., which was by 5.3 % less, however, their value was by 10.8 % (by CZK 35.1 bn.) higher than a year ago. Structurally the construction value per building permit developed differently; upon the aggregate year-on-year growth by 17.0 % the value for residential buildings increased by 10.4 % and for non-residential buildings by 22.9 %, which represents construction of big structures, in particular administrative buildings, warehouses, plants and transport infrastructure.

 Less construction orders with a significantly higher value Construction enterprises (building and civil engineering) in 2006 made more than 88 thousand new construction orders, i.e. less by 5.9 % year-on-year, but the value of the orders increased by 20.2 % to CZK 299.0 bn. Orders in the Czech Republic in the end of 2006 at the total number of 15 495 and volume of CZK 217.8 bn. (year-on-year increase by 12.2 %) represented the supply of construction work for almost 10 months.

• Increase in housing construction

The favourable mortgage market environment and anticipated changes in VAT charged on housing construction contributed in 2006 to the growth of issued building permits for 43 747 new dwellings (year-on-year increase by 8.3 %). This number included 36 556 newly completed dwellings (8.5 %) and 7 191 new dwellings

produced by refurbishment of existing buildings (-9.4 %). 30 187 dwellings were completed, which meant a year-on-year decrease by 8.1 %. This decrease was caused by preference of new housing construction to completion works. The total number of dwellings in construction as at 31/12/2006 increased by 8.7 % year-on-year to 168 762 housings.

 Sales revenues from services accelerated their growth Sales in services in 2006 grew in real terms by 5.0 % year-on-year, of which by 6.1 % in Q4. This growth was mostly caused by IT activities (annually by 9.1 %). Transport was another successful branch showing a sales increase by 5.2 %, with the highest contribution of railway transport. Considerable increases were again recorded by retail trade including the segment of motor vehicles (6.4 %).
