## Information

Based on an agreement with the *Czech Statistical Office the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs of the Czech Republic* replaces the present indicator of registered unemployment in the Czech Republic from January 2013 by a new one called *Share of unemployed persons*, which expresses the share of unemployed job applicants aged 15 to 64 years of all residents of the same age.
