

Methodological notes

The process of town promotion had passed a long-term historical progress. For more details see the publication *Historical lexicon of municipalities of the Czech Republic 1869-2005 (Historický lexikon obcí České republiky 1869-2005)* or its electronic form on <http://www.czso.cz/csu/2004edicniplan.nsf/p/4128-04>.

According to Act No. 234/2006 Coll., which modifies Act No. 128/2000 Coll., on municipalities, 45 new towns started to exist as of 30 January 2007. Total 574 towns, i.e. municipalities with authorized municipal office, there were in the Czech Republic as of 30 January 2007.

This publication contents towns that had more than 5 thousands of inhabitants in at least one year over the analysed period (1991-2006). Further, six towns were added to list at least two towns from every district (except for district Brno-město composed of one town): Starý Plzeňec (district Plzeň-město), Třešňov (district Plzeň-sever), Hrádek (district Rokycany), Trmice (district Ústí nad Labem), Zlaté Hory (district Jeseník) and Konice (district Prostějov). Total 284 municipalities are stated.

Town Trmice has been existed as an independent municipality only since 1 January 1994 (when it separated from Ústí nad Labem) so data for period 1991–1993 are missing.

Based on the Notice No. 513/2006 Coll., which modifies the Notice No. 564/2002 Coll., on the districts of the Czech Republic, 119 municipalities were shifted between the districts as of 1 January 2007. This publication states town relates to the territories of districts effective as of 1 January 2007.

The population as of 31 December of given year is computed as the population as of 31 December of last year plus natural increase (live births minus deaths) and net migration (immigrants minus emigrants). It is not true for years in which the population census was done. Here it refers to the stock

as of 31 December 2001 that follows the Population and Housing Census (1 March 2001) results and not follows the stock as of 31 December 2000.

Besides natural flow and migration the changes in numbers of inhabitants are referable to merging or separating of municipalities or their parts. The administrative changes concerning here-published towns are stated at the end of Methodological notes.

All data refer to the residents of the selected towns irrespective of citizenship. Since 2001, the figures also include (in accordance with the Population and Housing Census 2001) foreigners with long-term stay (i.e. the stay based on visa over 90 days, as stipulated by Act No. 326/1999 Coll.) and foreigners with granted asylum status (in compliance with Act No. 325/1999 Coll.). Since 1st May 2005, in accordance with amendment No. 326/1999 Coll., the figures include citizens of the European Union with temporary stay on the territory of the Czech Republic, and citizens of other countries with long-term stay. The data contain also information on events (marriages, births and deaths) of permanent residents of CR that occurred abroad.

All data concerning 'age' always refers to completed age. The dependency ratio is the number of persons aged 65 and over per 100 persons aged 0-14.

Marriages are included into Towns according to the permanent residency of the groom, **divorces** are included according to the last common residency of spouses, **births** according to the permanent residency of mother and **abortions** according to the permanent residency of woman.

Exact definition live birth, stillbirth and abortion as indicated in publication Demographic Yearbook of the Czech Republic (code 4019-06).

In the period 1991-1993 the numbers of deaths by causes were classified according to the 9th decennial revision of the International Statistical Classification of Diseases (ICD-9) and since 1994 there have been classified according to the 10th decennial revision of the International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems (ICD-10). In this publication there are introduced selected groups of causes over the whole analysed period although the definition of the group can be slightly different by revision.

Migration is the change in a municipality of residence within the territory of the Czech Republic or across the borders of the Czech Republic (external migration).

Symbols used in tables:

- The symbol of dash in place of a figure indicates that the phenomenon did not occur.
- . The symbol of dot shows that the figure is not available or cannot be relied on.
- x The symbol of small cross shows that the figure is not applicable.
- 0 The symbol of zero in a table designates figures smaller than half of the unit of measure chosen.
