

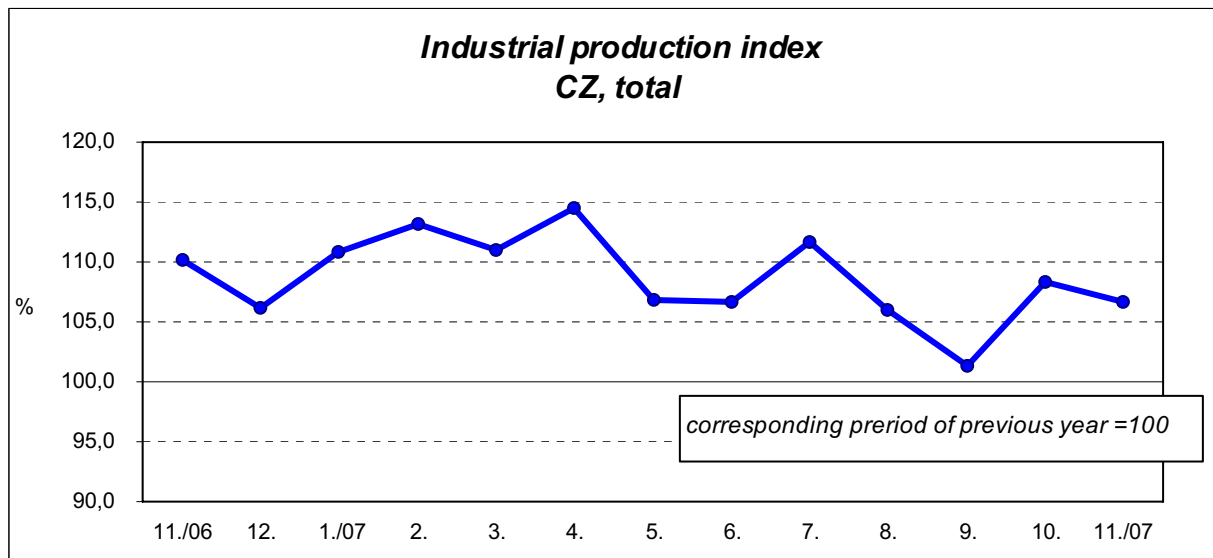
COMMENT

Industrial production **in November 2007** grew by 6.7% year-on-year and by 2.8% month-on-month. Compared with the average month of the base year 2000, **industrial production** in November 2007 was by 82.8% higher. Year-on-year saw November **higher** industrial production in sections: D – ‘Manufacturing’ (+6.9%) and E – ‘Electricity, gas and water supply’ (+7.2%), while the decrease occurred in section C – ‘Mining and quarrying’ dropped’ (–3.5%).

In November 2007, the output of ‘Manufacturing’ increased especially in subsections: DM – ‘Manufacture of transport equipment’ (+21.2%), DK – ‘Manufacture of machinery and equipment n.e.c’ (+11.8%), DL – ‘Manufacture of electrical and optical equipment’ (+11.2%) and DH – ‘Manufacture of rubber and plastic products’ (+7.0%). Year-on-year the decrease was seen in the sections DF – ‘Manufacture of coke, refined petroleum’ (–26.8%), DG – ‘Manufacture of chemicals, chemical products and man-made fibres’ (–7.9%), DB – ‘Manufacture of textiles and textile products’ (–6.9%), DD – ‘Manufacture of wood and wood products’ (–4.8%) and DA – ‘Manufacture of food products, beverages and tobacco’ (–2.9%).

The November year-on-year IPI broken down by **main industrial grouping** increased most in the grouping for ‘Consumer Durables’ (+25.4%) and dropped in MIG ‘Consumer Non-Durables’ (–5.2%).
